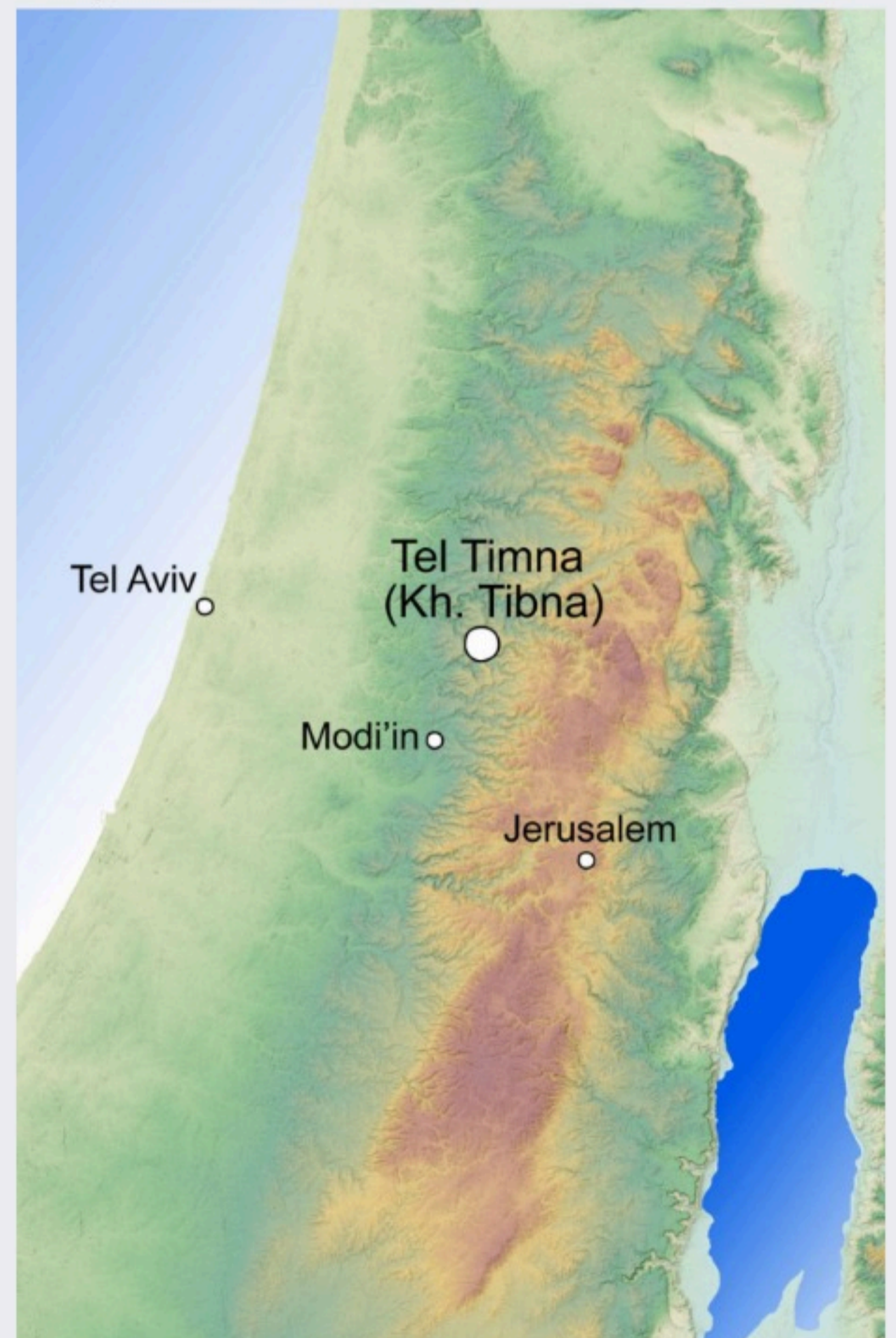


Tel Timna-Background

Tel Timna (Kh. Tibna) is one of the biblical mounds in the central hill country of Israel. The mound has not yet been excavated. Historical references describe it as the city of Joshua Bin Nun, a Hellenistic-Hasmonean fortified site, an Early Roman district capital and an Early Ottoman period village. Based on the archaeological surveys the site reached its peak during the Iron Age II and the Hellenistic-Early Roman Periods.

The site is in southern Samaria-Israel's heartland. The excavations will be secured by the IDF and security guards.

The expedition's accommodations will be at the nearby settlement of Halamish (Neve-Tzuf). Room and board will be provided from Sunday afternoon through Friday afternoon. There will be weekly lectures and fieldtrips.
